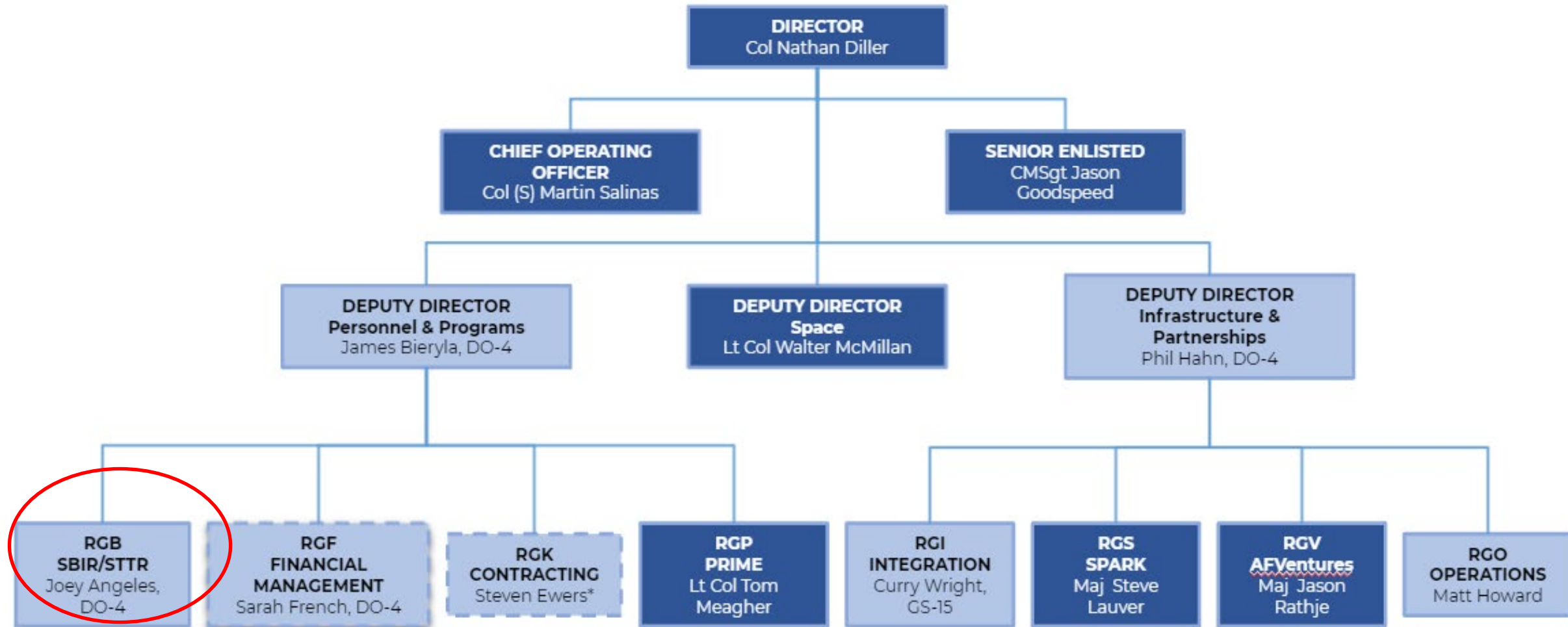

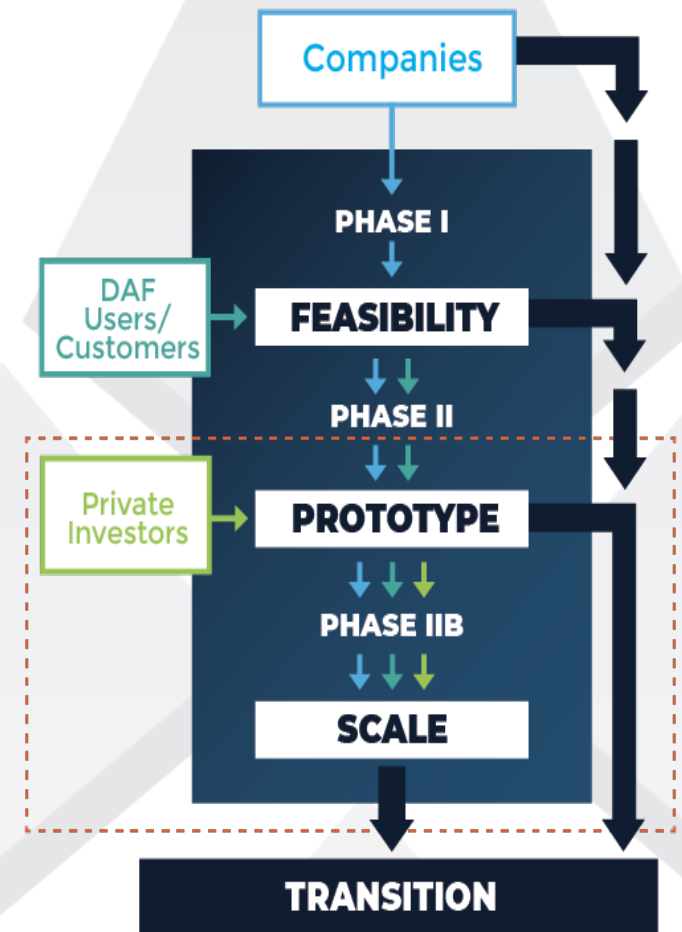
- Mission Statement
 - Facilitate the DAF SBIR/STTR Life Cycle to enable transition of innovative technology to the Warfighter.
- Vision Statement
 - Capitalize and grow institutional knowledge within the dynamic SBIR/STTR ecosystem.
- Key Activities/Responsibilities
 - **Integrates, enables, and facilitates the DAF SBIR/STTR life cycle activities.** This includes, but not limited to, *topic development, solicitations, proposal reviews, evaluation, selection, integrated master plan and schedule, change board process, requirements approval process, standard processes and statutory reporting.* Integrates and supports the AFRL Technology Directorates and other organizations with the execution of the defense focused technologies without clear, near-term, non-defense potential. Integrates and supports the execution of the Space Force SBIR/STTR program. *Manages the cost, schedule, and performance of the DAF SBIR/STTR program.* Responsible for timely response to congressional inquiries.

Purpose of SBIR/STTR

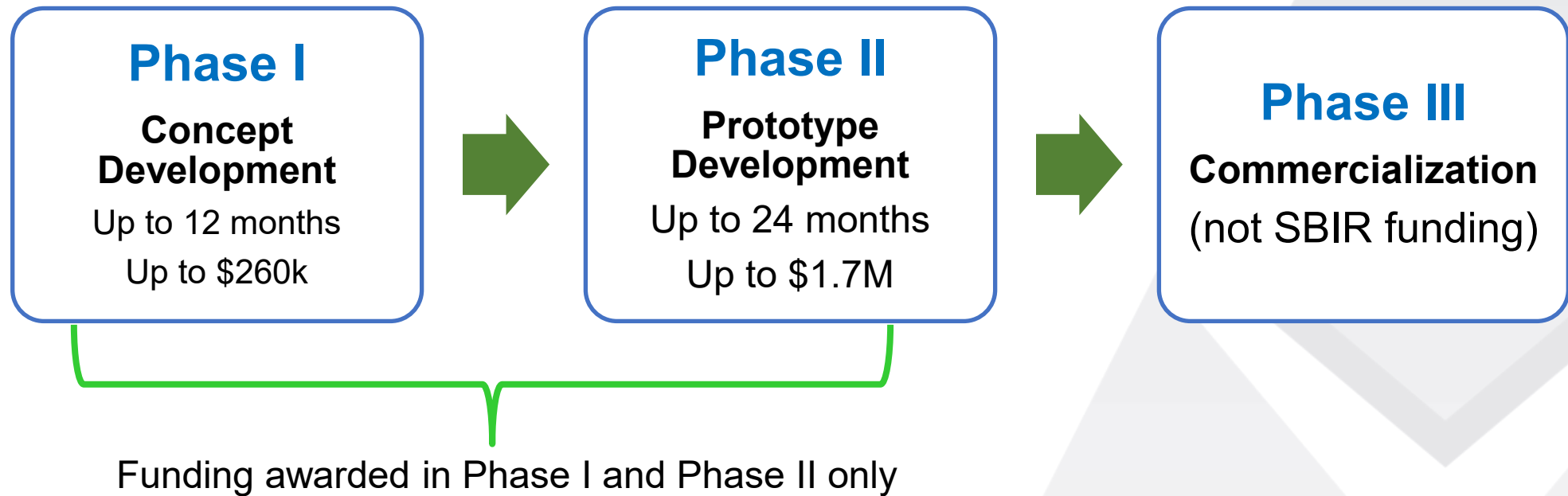
§ 1. This Act may be cited as the “Small Business Act.”

“Research and development are major factors in the growth and progress of industry and the national economy. The expense of carrying on research and development programs is beyond the means of many small-business concerns, and such concerns are handicapped in obtaining the benefits of research and development programs conducted at Government expense. These small-business concerns are thereby placed at a competitive disadvantage. This weakens the competitive free enterprise system and prevents the orderly development of the national economy. **It is the policy of the Congress that assistance be given to small-business concerns to enable them to undertake and to obtain the benefits of research and development in order to maintain and strengthen the competitive free enterprise system and the national economy.**”

DAF SBIR/STTR Program Office awards Government contracts, not research grants!

SBIR Overview

- **Small Business Innovation Research (SBIR)**
 - Established by Congress in 1982
 - 3-Phased Process
 - **Phase I:** Concept;
 - **Phase II:** Maturation;
 - **Phase III:** Commercialization
 - Solicits proposals & awards funding to small business for federal research & development, production services, or any combination of these, to meet agency needs & missions
- **Used to research and develop solutions for technical challenges such as:**
 - Capital deficiency
 - Service life limitation
 - Excessive cost
 - Functional problem hindering missions effectiveness

STTR Overview

- **Small Business Technology Transfer (STTR)**
 - Established by Congress in 1992
 - What's the difference?
 - STTR Program requires a search partner consisting of one of the following:
 - University
 - Federally funded Research & Development Center
 - Qualified non-profit research institution
- **Required evaluation of commercial potential in Phase I and Phase II applications**
- **Create vehicles moving ideas from Research Institutions into the “Marketplace”**

How to Participate

- **Three Key Opportunities:**

- **Open Topic:**

- Eligible companies can pitch an emerging technology concept for funding

- **Specific Topic:**

- Submit a Problem Statement to discover solutions to specific problems/risks/issues/opportunities

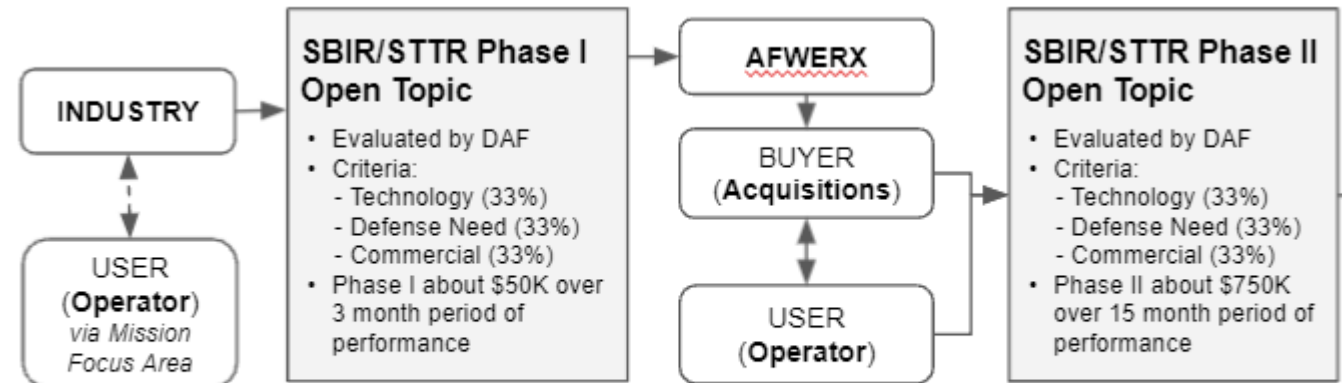
- **Tactical Fund Increase (TACFI) & Strategic Fund Increase (STRATFI) Program**

- Follow-on or supplemental Phase II SBIR/STTR awards

Open Topic

- Operated under AFWERX's Division, AFVentures (AFRL/RGV)

- Mission: Leverage commercial technology to deliver better capability to the warfighter, faster
- Allows businesses the flexibility to bring us tools and technology we didn't think to ask for



Phase I Open Topic Awards

About 5000 proposals / year and 1000 (20%) selected for Phase I

100s of DAF S&T, Acquisition, and Operational SMEs recruited to *independently* evaluate proposals

DECISION MAKERS

1. Operator, crafting focus areas
2. S&E, evaluating tech criteria
3. Operator, evaluating defense criteria
4. Acquirer, evaluating commercial
5. Finance, for RDT&E validation
6. Contracting, for policy compliance

Phase II Open Topic Awards

About 1200 proposals / year and 300 (25%) selected for Phase II

End-user must confirm requirement & acquirer must confirm PM support via memorandum prior to evaluation
Evaluation rigor increased in Phase II

Specific Topics

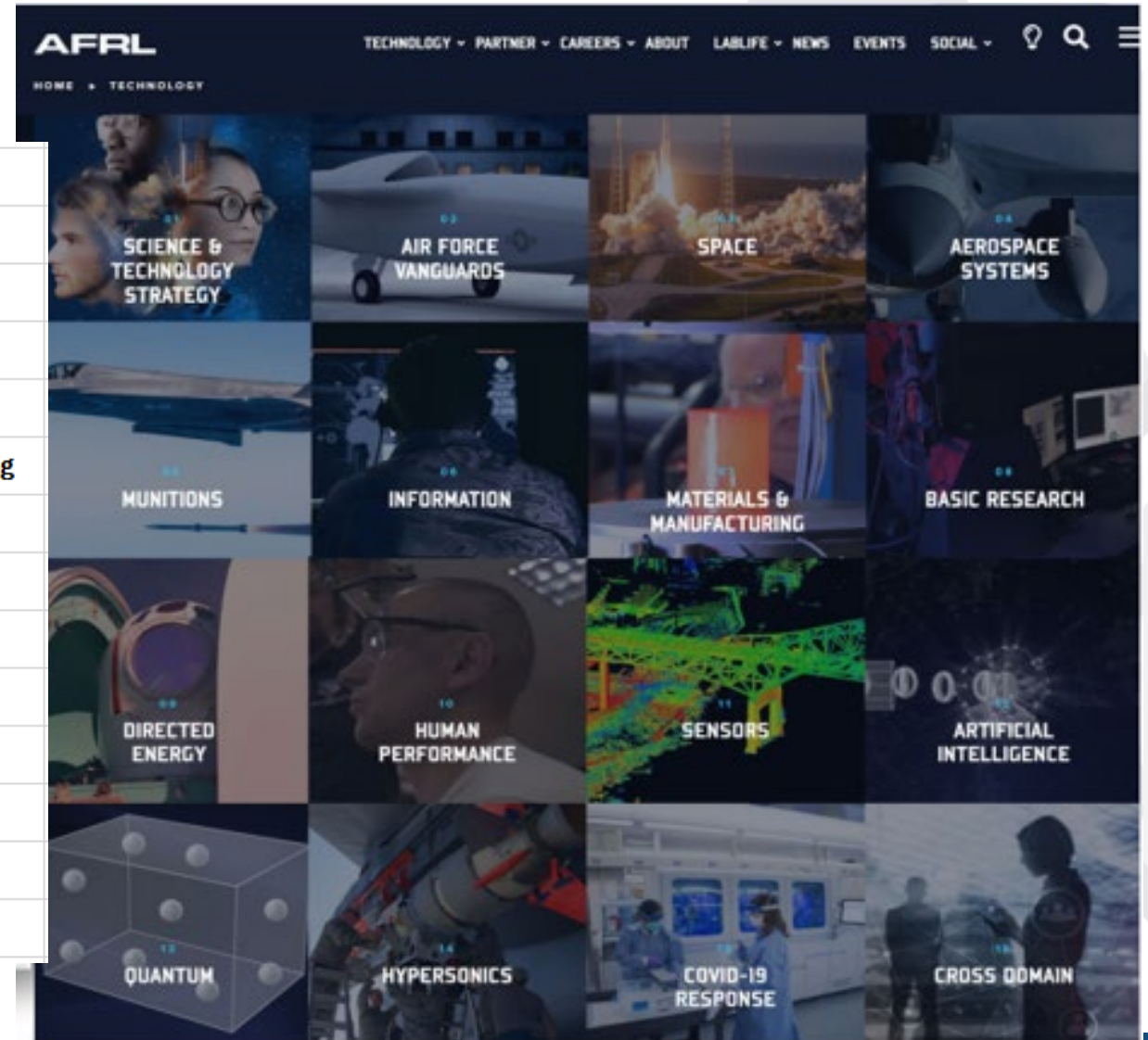
- **Operated under AFWERX's Division, AF SBIR/STTR Program Office (AFRL/RGB):**
 - Will your technology solve a Warfighter requirement
- **Topics seek innovative solution(s) to a specific problem (Problem Statement)**
- **Budget allocated to the AFRL Technical Directorates (TDs):**
 - Programs with Problem Statements must partner with an AFRL TD to participate in the Specific Topic Program
- **Roles & Responsibilities:**
 - AFRL TD PK conducts solicitation & execution
 - Topic Author: Writes & Develops the topic
 - Topic Owner (Chief Scientist): Provides budget & oversight authority on all SBIR/STTR w/in their organization
 - SBIR/STTR Program Manager: Coordinates between AFRL/RGB & the Topic Authors/Owners

TACFI/STRATFI Program

- Operated under AFWERX's Division, Prime (AFRL/RGB)
- Designed to scale to transition
- Requires matched funding & customer ownership
- Eligibility
 - Phase II active or recent (within three years)
 - Not currently executing a TACFI/STRATFI effort
 - Able to achieve matching/investment funding requirements
 - Able to obtain end-user & customer memorandum of understanding, which identifies a multi-functional team to support the effort

TACFI/STRATFI Program

- **Different Topics Companies Should Expect to See in a Solicitation:**
 - Requires matched funding
 - Requires customer ownership
 - Designed to scale to transition (when supplemental funding is required)
- **Tactical Fund Increase (TACFI)**
 - Tactical needs with low capital requirements
 - Fund request for >\$375K, <\$1.7M
 - Requires 1:1 Government or 1:1 Private Matching
- **STRATEGIC Funding Increase (STRATFI)**
 - Strategic needs with high capital requirements
 - Fund request for >\$3M, <\$15M
 - Customer must be DAF PEO or equivalent
 - Requires 2:1 Government OR 1:1 Government & 2:1 Private Matchings
